

## Degree Pathway

### A.A.S. in Internet and Information Technology – Catalog Year 2024-25

The number of credits you take each year will determine when you graduate. To graduate on time, you are strongly encouraged to enroll in at least 30 credits toward your degree during the calendar year, including fall and spring semesters and winter and summer sessions. This Degree Pathway is designed for students who place into **developmental English and math**. Additional pathways are available for students who place directly into ENGL-101 and MA-119/MA-114 or who are interested in the NYC Jobs CEO Council Software Engineering Apprenticeship Program.
