Minutes for the meeting held on Wednesday January 10th, 2018

The Committee on Course and Standing met on Friday Wednesday January 10th, 2018 at 10:00 a.m. in Room # A-104.

Discussion:

The Committee met to review and decide upon the dismissal of students.

Reports, with associated recommended actions, were generated by the Enrollment Management Team to help the Members of Committee on Course & Standing decide upon the final dismissal of the students. This process of reviewing based on the projection is basically to help students successfully graduate.

The group of students who had a GPA over a 1.5 and projected to succeed and graduate with a 2.0 GPA were all approved for continued probation. In all **188 students**.

A group of 50 students who did not attain a GPA of 1.8 or above during Fall 2017 and had attempted over 10 credits, were projected not to achieve a GPA of 2.0. The Committee decided to **dismiss all 50** students.

A group of **60** students who have earned over 60 credits and were not able to achieve a GPA of 2.0 were projected not to achieve the required GPA were reviewed by the Committee but were all **dismissed**.

A group of **477** student with a GPA below 1.5 was reviewed by the Committee members. Out of those 13 were approved.

The Committee decided to retain all the students who had a GPA of 1.5 or below and were registered for the spring 2018 semester. However, only one student was registered and was granted Continued Probation.

The students who had attempted 10 or more credits and had a GPA of below 1.0 were dismissed.

While deciding upon the retention of the students, besides the projection by enrollment management team, the Committee also reviewed possibility of students' success in graduating.
